LOOKING BACK

It was a stabilizing year at Bandelier. Superintendent Dennis Vasquez assembled his management team, including a new fire manager, new resource manager, new chief of interpretation, and an assistant superintendent—a rare position in the Park Service these days. To orient his new people, he scheduled a two-day retreat with long-time staff and members of the community to get a sense of their perception of Bandelier and its place in the community. The rangers went about their duties serving visitors—it was hard to find a parking place during holiday seasons. Archaeologist Rory Gauthier diligently surveyed his allotted acreage for archaeological sites (including *Casa Dorotea* on the rim of Lummis Canyon). Wildlife biologist Stephen Fettig monitored his exclosure plots to determine effects of large grazing animals on the surrounding ecosystem. Restoration specialist Angelyn Rivera started the arduous task of documenting and conserving Bandelier cavates. Chief of Interpretation Lynne Dominy proposes the most amazing new projects, including a set of seminars on Bandelier at the Los Alamos branch of UNM. Her ideas just pour forth!

Bandelier personnel also participated in a number of outreach programs in 2001. Trail specialist Glen Ryan spent a busy season training and directing volunteers doing trail work, both in Bandelier and in areas burned in the Cerro Grande Fire. Rangers also assisted in planting grasses and ponderosa pine trees in the burned areas.

Bandelier provided support for the new Valles Caldera National Preserve. Vegetation Specialist Brian Jacobs coordinated plant surveys on the preserve as well as continued his pinyon-juniper studies. Craig Allen is coordinator for scientific studies on the preserve. It is an arduous task; the number of studies is mind-boggling. Geographic Information System guru Kay Beeley is acting keeper of the Preserve's GIS data. John Hogan did heroic duty as a volunteer coordinator for fire rehabilitation as well as Valles work. (Craig, Kay, and John are actually US Geological Survey employees, but few people bother with the distinction.)

The National Park Service and Rocky Mountain Director Karen Wade provided good support to Bandelier. Things seem to be moving in a positive direction after the chaos from the fire of 2000.



LOOKING FORWARD

It is too soon to tell how the events of September 11 will affect the Park Service and Bandelier. The government perceives its primary duty as providing for the common defense. One presumes that other budgets will be cut.

The new staff at Bandelier is a savvy group that is doing well finding outside funding. Angelyn Rivera obtained an Architectural Conservation Grant from the J. Paul Getty Trust for \$73,000. The Getty Grant money is designated to document and conserve more cavate ruins in conjunction with the Vanishing Treasures Program. The grant also provides training for local pueblo youth and graduate students in conservation and management. Stephen Fettig received a grant from the National Park Foundation to perform nesting bird surveys in four National Park units. These surveys provide baselines against which to measure the health of bird populations into the future. Like canaries in coal mines, if indicator species numbers fall, something is wrong. The Friends of Bandelier's involvement in some of these grants is to write letters of support and recommendation.

Dennis and his new staff took a fresh look at all the departments at Bandelier. One thing that became immediately obvious was the inadequacy of the old lodge as staff headquarters. Dennis proposes and is actively promoting a move of administrative functions to Los Alamos. He hopes to have an integrated facility also housing the Los Alamos office of the Forest Service and the Valles Caldera Trust administrative teams. It is an excellent idea. The public expects proper stewardship of public land and expects the managing agencies to cooperate and get along. It actually happened fairly well after the fire, so we know it is possible.

By law, the superintendent of Bandelier is on the board of the Valles Caldera Trust governing the new Valles Caldera National Preserve. The preserve and Bandelier have a common boundary. It is not clear how the two will interact; the Trust Board is still grappling with how to manage the preserve. We, the public, expect seamless harmony. To this date, that seems to be the case. The Friends of Bandelier board concentrates with single-minded doggedness on helping Bandelier. The Trust board is expecting to establish a Friends group of its own for the preserve.

Fire Recovery

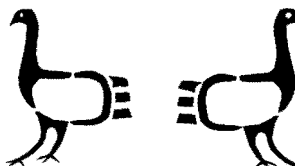
